

DEATH SUMMONS GEORGE P. ALBERT

Was Veteran of Mexican and
Civil Wars; Attained Age
Of 91 Years.

THREE CHILDREN SURVIVE

George P. Albert, 91 years old, veteran of the Mexican and Civil Wars, died at 8 o'clock last night at his home, 1008 East Washington Street.

He was a stove patternmaker, and for years he had been employed at the Albert N. Webb Company, stove manufacturers. For more than eighteen years Mr. Albert did not miss a day at his place of employment.

He was born January 18, 1830, near St. Matthews. During the Mexican War he served under Gen. Winfield Scott, and during the Civil War under General Rosseau.

While celebrating his ninetieth birthday anniversary Mr. Albert declared that his one regret was that I am unable to help lick the Kaiser."

Mr. Albert was twice married, the first time in 1851, and the second time in 1876. For forty years he was a deacon of the Franklin Street Baptist Church.

Surviving him are his widow, Mrs. Josephine Gregory Albert; two sons, Harry C. and Claude Albert, a daughter, Miss Mary Albert.

Funeral services will be held at 8 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at the Franklin Street Baptist Church. Burial will be in Eastern Cemetery.
