HE WAS A VETERAN OF CIVIL WAR.

**Funeral of William R. Scott Will
Take Place This Morning.**

The funeral of William R. Scott, who died Saturday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. John Welker, 3108 Bank street, will be held from the residence at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The burial will be in Eastern cemetery.

Mr. Scott was a veteran of the Civil War. He enlisted in Company A, Twelfth Kentucky volunteers, and participated in all the principal engagements of his regiment. He received an honorable discharge at the close of the war, and some years later was appointed a United States Government storekeeper, which position he held until his death. Mr. Scott was twice married. He is survived by his second wife, Mrs. Mollie Scott, a daughter by his first wife, Mrs. John Welker, and six children by his second wife, John, Harry, Robert, Albert, Jennie and Lulle Scott.
