

FUNERAL TO-DAY.

SERVICES OVER BODY OF THE OLDEST POSTAL CLERK.

John D. Strassburg Will Be Buried
This Afternoon In the East-
ern Cemetery.

The funeral services of John Dedrick Strassburg, the oldest postal clerk, who died of senility Monday afternoon at his home, 940 Washington street, will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the residence and at 2:30 o'clock at the German Methodist Episcopal church. The body will be buried in Eastern cemetery.

The pallbearers have been selected as follows: Andrew Edinger, Jacob Edinger, John Stitz, George Stitz, Frank Weber and Edward Peter.

Mr. Strassburg was eighty-eight years old and was the oldest postal clerk in the world. He was born in Hanover, Germany, but at the age of thirteen years he came to America, and after receiving his education in Lawrenceburg, Ind., he removed to Baltimore, where he was married. Later he came to Louisville and joined the postal service when Dr. H. Mosby was postmaster of Louisville, in 1843.
