LONG SEARCH ENDS WHEN BODY IS FOUND IN THE OHIO

Edward Otto, of 646 South Sixth Street, Was Veteran of Franco-Prussian War.

A six weeks' search for Edward Otto, who lived at 646 South Sixth street, ended yesterday when his body was found floating in the canal at the foot of Twenty-second street. A note in a pocketbook read: "Take mv body to Lee Cralle's undertaking esand Chestnut Sixth tablishment. streets." At the time of his disappearance Otto left a note in his room. in which he stated he intended to commit sulcide. The body was badly decomposed.

Otto was 56 years old and was a veteran of the Franco-Prussian war. So far as known he left no relatives. He carried an insurance policy, which will pay the expenses of his funeral. Private funeral services will be held at 10 o'clock this morning at Cralle's chapel and buriat will be in Eastern cemetery.
